

How to write the methods section of a research paper: A handy checklist

## Methods section

## Key writing tips:

- Role: The methods section of a research paper forms the central component of the study and justifies the validity and reliability of the research
- Purpose: The methods section is meant to enable others to reproduce or verify the research results, so write this in a clear, concise manner and include all relevant details
- Approach: Take the top-down approach to identify details of experiments that are critical and relevant for readers; this helps ensure vital information is highlighted properly and not lost in unnecessary data and technicalities
- Consistency: Use same experiment names as headings, and preferably in the same order, in the results and methods section to make it simple for readers to locate or corroborate information

## Do's when writing the methods section

| Follow the Journal guidelines to                          |

| structure the methods section                             |
| Arrange different sections to tell a story                |
| Define and explain the objects and procedure              |
| Always include relevant information                       |
| Follow a consistent sequence order similar to the results |
| Write for the audience                                    |
| Include information on data interpretation and analysis   |

## Don'ts when writing the methods section

| Don't elaborate on specifics of common methods/procedure |

| Don't add unnecessary details                            |
| Don't discuss results                                    |
| Don't make the section hulky                             |
